

AKT topics from seeing patients

Use a new sheet for every surgery. With each patient, only write down what you (i) **definitely don't know (RED ITEMS)** an (ii) **are not totally sure about (AMBER ITEMS)**. Do not write down **items you definitely know (GREEN ITEMS)**. Keep it super brief. No sentences. Also, don't just focus on their PC, look in their medical record at their PMH (e.g a person may have RhA), DH (e.g. a person is on a NOAC etc). Remember, the AKT exam is based on what the Examiners have seen as working GPs in their surgeries i.e. REAL patient presentations. Also, by doing this, you are more likely to remember things when you read things WITH PURPOSE.
