- Patient Safety & Quality of Care: delivering quality, clinical governance, safety culture, learning cultures & learning organisations; improving quality identifying and reducing risk, looking at systems, processes and information systems; research & academic activity audit, SEA, complaints, other projects and prescribing reviews.
- The GP in the Wider Professional Environment: strategic management; leadership & shared leadership; managing teams; looking after ourselves and our colleagues; the green agenda looking after the environment, rationing, using resources economically and sustainably.
- **Enhancing Professional Knowledge:** evidence based practice searching for evidence (internet, journals etc), critical appraisal, applying research, doing research; teaching and learning you and others.
