Tiered Contribution Rate

Please tick one of the boxes stating your provisional tiered contribution rate* for the current (April-March) pension year; refer to www.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/pensions/rates 0910.aspx for more guidance in respect of year 2009/10. The box you tick must remain consistent in all the Form B you complete from April to March and must correlate with "Box d" at Part 2. If at year end, it is found that the rate was too low you will have to pay arrears based on the correct rate. If the rate was too high you will be due a refund from your PCT / LHB.
